Grants.

In a small community like ours, where we only have 1,150 Village residents and roughly half as many houses, applying for state and federal grants play an important role in seeing our projects come to fruition. We know this reality well, as the Village received over \$7 million in state and federal grants to improve our Wastewater Treatment Plant and to mitigate potential Gorge Creek flooding.

Now that these important projects are completed, the Village Board is turning our attention to other priorities: new sidewalks, sewer line extensions, improving the Village Pool, etc. While we can and we have and we will make incremental progress on some fronts, such as residential sidewalks, our resources are limited to tackle these bigger projects unless we can bring our hard-earned dollars back to Middleburgh from Albany and Washington, D.C.

With that in mind, the Village Board has decided to make a strong push for grant funding in the coming years, which is why the back of this newsletter contains an anonymous survey we would like to ask as many of our residents as possible to complete and mail back to the *Village of Middleburgh*, *P.O. Box 789*, *Middleburgh*, *N.Y.*, 12122, so that we can identify what you prioritize for the next five to ten years as projects we should work towards.
